




Introduction to FirstNet

What if first responders had access to a cellular data network that was always available, even when major carrier networks were down due to natural disasters or major events? Public safety communications is key to saving lives and first responders need priority and preemption over regular commercial traffic to complete their life saving missions.


This is where the new, nationwide initiative known as FirstNet comes in.

The U.S. Tax Relief and Job Creation Act of 2012 ("The Act") created FirstNet, an independent authority within the National Telecommunications and Information Agency (NTIA), charged with building a nationwide high-speed broadband cellular data network exclusively for public safety. The Act included \$7B in funding and 20 MHz of spectrum in the 700 MHz band—the same amount of spectrum Verizon uses in its nationwide 4G LTE network.



FirstNet Spectrum

FirstNet’s mission is to provide first responders with a nationwide private cellular data network built to public safety standards, providing interoperability, priority, coverage and capacity.

Mr. Fortunato retired in January 2009 from the Fond du Lac Police Department after 31 years at the rank of Major in the position of Assistant Chief of Police. He attended the FBI National Academy's 204th Session, has a Bachelor of Science Degree (Quality and Productivity Management) from Marian College, and an MBA from Cardinal Stritch University. He has been appointed as the Single Point of Contact (SPOC) for WI for the FirstNet Broadband Initiative. He also acts as the Attorney General’s designee on the State Interoperability Council.

About WiPSB


The Wisconsin Public Safety Broadband (WiPSB) program, which is managed by the Wisconsin Department of Justice (DOJ) Interoperability Unit, was established to help determine Wisconsin's requirements for the Nationwide Public Safety Broadband Network (NPSBN) and prepare the State to consult with FirstNet. WiPSB's priority is to ensure that FirstNet produces a network that meets the needs and expectations of Wisconsin's public safety community.

In order to identify assets, locate problematic coverage areas and model a sustainable plan, the WiPSB Project Team will be engaging Wisconsin's public safety stakeholders to provide requirements specific to your agencies. These requirements will be relayed to FirstNet for use in the development of Wisconsin's State Plan and the construction of the network within the State.

Constructing a network to meet the needs of public safety requires your input, and during the course of this project, we will be identifying your wireless broadband needs through survey data and interactive coverage reviews.


Requirements Gathering

Through our web-based **User Population Survey** we will assess the total number of potential NPSBN users, identify device and network requirements, and assess barriers to broadband adoption. In order to ensure that your data contributes to the State's strategic plan **please make sure to complete the User Population Survey by September 16th 2016.**





Interactive **Coverage Review Meetings** will allow first responders from counties, cities, tribes, and State agencies to provide first-hand information about coverage requirements and existing insufficiencies within your jurisdictions. We will hold an individual meeting with each county in the state on an ongoing basis through February 2017.



Sample Coverage Review Outputs

On September 30, 2016, the data that has been gathered to date will be turned over to FirstNet for use in the development of an implementation plan for Wisconsin and will form the foundation of the State’s strategic plan.

Gene Oldenburg is the Statewide Interoperability Coordinator (SWIC) for Wisconsin. He is responsible for

working with various local, state and federal partners in coordinating numerous public safety voice and data interoperable communications initiatives. He joined the Crime Information Bureau (CIB) at the Wisconsin Department of Justice in September 2014.

Mr. Oldenburg served as a law enforcement officer with the West Milwaukee Police Department for over 32 years. He retired in 2009 after a 17 year tenure as Chief of Police. In 2010, Mr. Oldenburg became the first Regional Interoperability Coordinator (RIC) for the eight counties that comprise the Southeast Wisconsin Region. 
